ORDER INVALIDATING NOTICE

On February 6, 2013, American Honda Finance Corp., filed a motion for relief from stay/abandonment. This motion was accompanied by a form of “drop-dead” notice, as evidenced by record No. 60. There is no authority for the use of a “drop-dead” notice in the circumstances of the motion in the Hammond Division of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Northern District of Indiana. Counsel for the movant would be well advised to adhere to the procedural rules of the Hammond Division of the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Northern District of Indiana – the next time that an inappropriate “drop-dead” notice is utilized with respect to a motion for stay relief/abandonment, the court will issue an order to show cause which will require the attorney who utilized that inappropriate notice to personally appear before the court to answer as to why sanctions should not be imposed upon him/her for violation of Fed.R.Bankr.P. 9011.

IT IS ORDERED that the notice included in record No. 60 is stricken from the record, and is invalid for any purpose. A preliminary hearing with respect to the record No. 59 motion will be set by separate order.
